Gordon G. Newell, 70, of Leeds passed away on August 1, 2021, at Hartford Hospital after suffering a sudden stroke. He was born in Northampton on July 10, 1951, he was the second son to the late Raymond D. Newell Jr. and to Irene (Harubin) Newell.
